



Consumer Profile

Based on the article of clothing, having Women's blazers our Consumer Market is guided more towards women. We have styles that are considered more feminine such as blazer dresses and asymmetrical. Our main target market is women around the ages of late 20s to early 30s. We focused these styles more on the younger demographics instead of the usual pantsuit that is usually seen at corporate offices by an older group of people. Having these styles changed throughout the years blazers are something that has been dressed down or up. We have seen blazers being worn with ripped jeans and sneakers for a more casual laid-back look and of course as a simple office outfit.

For Spring 2022 we would predict to see many older styles/ Silhouettes make a comeback. We also see many colors coming back such as bright pinks and yellows and the simple beiges and neutrals which is a staple color in every year including spring, offering a more fresh and airy look. As seen, on the Versace runway for 2021 we see many unique looks and colors. This helps us cue in more on our Target market since Blazers are seen as a more fancy statement piece.

According to Statista blazers were seen to have a \$1,623M revenue and the market is expected to keep growing through the years as women blazers are seen as a staple. As stated our target market is women ranging from the late 20s to early 30s and those who are married. For activities, they enjoy shopping and are into fashion and more "classy" looks and more put together in how they dress and are willing to splurge into getting good high-end quality statement pieces. As for salary we are targeting more middle-upper class with a ranging salary between \$70,000-\$95,000 yearly and have a more business professional occupation where blazers and suits are more commonly seen. This gives them the option to still wear these blazers to work and be professional but still have that chic side and style but can also change it up and wear the blazer for a night out. We want to have the blazers be versatile and can be used for each occasion.

Timeline & History

History of the Blazer

What is a Blazer?

A blazer is a lightweight flannel sports jacket that is loose-fitting. Generally the jacket comes in a double-breasted style, but it can also come in a single-breasted style as well. It is usually thigh-length and tailored in either two colors, plain navy or black. It also includes brass buttons, two side vents and traditionally has a breast-pocket badge. (Greatrex, 2005)

Origins of the Blazer

The origins of the blazer can be traced back to the frigate HMS Blazer's captain. Upon the visit of Queen Victoria to his ship in 1837, the captain had short double-breasted jackets made from navy blue serge (a durable twilled woolen or worsted fabric) created for his crew. Many say that the captain's inspiration for the jacket came from the heavier double-breasted reefer jacket. The crew's blazers included signature embellishments such as the shining Royal Navy buttons. This later became the official uniform for crew (Greatrex, 2005.)

As Royal Navy officers began to adopt the blazer into the uniform, popularity for it grew outside of those with clear connections to sea. Civilians eventually took notice of the naval blazer and started to have their own version created by local tailors. For the most part, anyone who participated in maritime activities and experiences began to wear it. For the civilian versions of the naval blazer, buttons with emblems were used. Also, if those buttons were not used, then simple flat brass buttons were (Greatrex, 2005).

The Rowing Blazer

In the 1800s, the single-breasted blazer jumped onto the scene when rowing clubs from esteemed colleges in England like Oxford and Cambridge added them to their warm-up gear (Nordstrom Trunk Club, 2020). For the rowers not to be affected by the coldness, they wore these loose-fitting jackets made from thick flannel that served as windbreakers. This style of the jacket came to be what is known as the classic blazer (Bucci, 2019). The rowing club blazers include three buttons, grosgrain accents, vibrant colors (Nordstrom Trunk Club, 2020). Although very stylish, the purpose of these blazers were to help spectators identify rowing teams when they were far from the shore during races (Bucci, 2019).

Like many athletes of different sports with letterman jackets or jerseys, the rowers began to wear their blazers around campus and not just when they were in the water (Nordstrom Trunk Club, 2020). This became a status symbol for them, demonstrating their team spirit, brotherly bond, and athletic success. Eventually, this became popular among other sports teams as well. Sports like Rugby, Croquet, and Soccer began to include blazers in their official team uniforms (Bucci, 2019).

The Start of Women in Blazers

The first time the popular sports jacket was associated with women was in a 1952 article featuring the Lady Margaret Boat Club at Cambridge. The team wore their jackets in "blazing red" color. This appearance showcased that the blazer was just fashionable on women as it was on men. Soon after, the blazer was no longer a collegiate essential and became a widespread wardrobe staple for many (Nordstrom Trunk Club, 2020).


Women in Blazers throughout the Years

Throughout the late nineteenth century and the Twentieth century, blazers started to have more of a presence in womenswear in the form of the pantsuit or trouser suit. The first to embrace the look was actress Sarah Bernhardt wore a trouser suit during the painting of a portrait, which caused much controversy (Nordstrom Trunk Club, 2020). In 1914, Coco Chanel debuted her take on the look, with her classic Chanel Suit which consisted of a fur-trimmed jacket and an ankle-length skirt to match. Then there was Andre Courreges, who made a womens pantsuit that was slim and minimalistic and could be worn during the day and evening time. Before this, women only wore pants during casual occasions (Sullivan, 2016).

By the 1980s the pantsuit had been revolutionized by Georgio Armani and was now known as the "power suit". This was during a time when women were securing their power and needed the attention off of their womanly figures. For the "career girl", Armani took away the sex appeal and brought in the seriousnes that women were needing at the time (Studholme, 2017). By the time the 2000s came around, colorful blazers were trending for women as well as swapping out pants for other statement pieces, such as evening dresses. In more recent times, the blazer itself was the dress. Being cut at the thigh, the style of the blazer in the newest addition, known as the blazer dress (Bass-Krueger, 2019).



Oversized Blazer

Inspired by men's business wear, *Oversized Blazers* (also known as *Boyfriend Blazers*) are a closet staple. Catered to Female's form, oversized blazers are cut larger than women's blazers. Allowing for more shoulder space & extra sleeve length. This style is very versatile, being able to be paired with pants or a jeans/t-shirt combination.

This trend is a nod to the 80's, a time when BIG was in. Big shoulder pads, bigger sizes, and of course oversized silhouettes. The blazer dress evolved from longer women's suits according to the article "how the women's blazer became a wardrobe staple" it states that "Women have been wearing suits for about 150 years. Back in the 1870s, actress Sarah Bernhardt was the center of a lot of controversy when she wore a custom trouser suit for a painted portrait. By the 20th century, women had embraced the look and began wearing long skirts with fitted jackets. But women's suits didn't receive the fashion industry's seal of approval until Coco Chanel designed a trimmed jacket and matching ankle-length skirt in 1914" this means that the blazer dress are somehow bring transform from the women's suit and has a big popularity right now with women becoming more independent and dressing more of business professional.



Cape Blazer

Cape Blazers, are a stylish mesh of a traditional blazer & a poncho. This trend manages to stay on the shoulders while being worn, leaving room for arm motion. The trend can be worn in many settings from work, to date night, a wedding, or even brunch.

It adds the right element of chic & dressy to any ensemble. The cape blazer has even been worn by politician **Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez** at the 2019, State of The Union. The best part of this trend is the versatility. Being able to be worn with tailored pants or a body con dress with heels. This seems as fancier to be thrown over a night dress the purpose of this is to have something over your dress or pants suit but not having it ruin your outfit like what a normal

jacket sometimes does. It is a more fancier way to offer a layer of protection "The earliest recorded instance of a cape dates to a 1066 illustration of a soldier or shepherd that had a cape draped across his shoulder. Another one in the 1300s depicted a woman with a cape attached to the collar of her dress. (Fun fact: during the medieval times, capes were referred to as "mantels." (Fashion book.com). We see this back in the 1900s when these capes were worn as as rainwear back in the military in europe and by the 1920s these capes were then shaped like cocoons and women usually wore them in companion to their evening looks.Lastly by the 1950s the cape blazer was redesigned and as it was more to be seen as a fashion statement.



Peplum Blazer

Peplum Blazers, is a trend that works with many body types. Whether petite, curvy, short or tall. This style is good for highlighting feminine curves. When looking for your perfect fit, it is best to be mindful of a balance between shoulders, hips and waist. This will create an hourglass silhouette. As for some ideas, on how to wear this trend. When going for a casual look, adding a pair of skinny jeans to this type of jacket will look very stylish & elegant. Best when worn with heeled boots or pumps, to elongate legs. When going for a business style attire, this blazer can be worn with a nice pair of black trousers. If you wanna pair a peplum jacket with a skirt, then you should choose A-line or pencil ones. To make an accent on your waist you can add a thin belt over a jacket.

The history of the peplum dates back to Ancient Greek clothing. It is usually made from wool, both Greek men and women wore loosely-fitted "peplos." During the Renaissance, the peplum took on a more structured form and extended outward like a short skirt. Peplums have since been cyclical, coming back in the '50s , the '80s (big shoulders, big hips) and the '90s".




Sailor Blazer

Sailor Blazers, are a nod to traditional sailor uniform jackets. What differs between this trend & traditional blazers are the cut & button details. Most sailor jackets have three to four buttons down each side of the jacket, while most common blazers have one or two buttons usually. The design is structured & a great choice when wanting to experiment with something different.

This trend is ideally seen in colors navy, & black. Also being adorned with gold/ silver accent buttons, along the sleeves as well. This trend looks best paired with a nice pair of denim jeans, preferably white or dark denim jeans. Also a pair of leather sneakers or boots, would complete the look. This is seen as a more nautical sailor look typically with a stripe shirt usually seen in movies a Sailor blazer is something you'll see in older movies. This nautical style dates back to around the late 1840s when Queen Victoria had a little sailor uniform made for her son on board a yacht (Rmg.co.uk) as she dates it back in her diary. Since then this style has taken off

all over the world. In the UK this was seen as national pride to wear in solidarity for the Navy during the war time. This then became for Fashionable you've also seen this as rock bands use to rock these sailor types blazers and added buttons and chains and padding and all these crazy extra accessories to really make it stand out. Then the gold button trend really seemed to stick as it is what we usually see now very simple and minimalistic gives you a really put together look.



Double Breasted Blazer

Double Breasted Blazers, have quite the silhouette that features a collared neckline and overlapping fronts. The front consists of two columns of parallel buttons. This trend is a great style statement and is best when worn casually. This blazer is sure to give any ensemble a crisp look.

Though double breasted blazers are usually big & boxy. When purchasing one, it should be noted the fit is close to the torso. So that it isn't extremely overwhelming to the body type of the person wearing it, so that it doesn't appear too short. "Yet, over time, the double-breasted jacket was slowly adapted into a more formal piece – a shift heralded in large part by the Duke of Windsor (who led many style trends of his time). However, even when he started wearing the style to official public outings, it was originally seen as gauche and poor taste". As the above information shows that the double breasted jacket came from reefer jacket which is not a unique thing in fashion industry because in fashion one piece of garment often got influence by another piece and the designer came up with a new piece of garment and makes it a more formal piece which you can fit in other occasions not a sports events.



Asymmetric Blazer

Asymmetric Blazers are not structured, due to its unique cut. This trend consists of a sharp design that drapes the attire quite artfully. This gives the blazer a look that is longer on one side & standard (short) on the other. This trend bridges the gap between edgy & timeless. This by far is one of a kind, by adding an elongated effect to either one side or the back of the blazer. It gives it some spunk, adding to quite a simple ensemble. Asymmetric has a lot of casual and workwear together this is why it gained its popularity as the article states that "combines a few of those things - business, casual, military, and asymmetric! I adore the military-like buttons on the front and the elongated pleating in the back. It makes for a perfect finish to a business ensemble or a great substitute for a jacket". Another way you'd see these are with an angel at the shoulders kind of like a "cold" shoulder type of look which will direct your eyes directly to your shoulders and give it more attention, these are trends that we can see coming up in the 2022 spring trend.


