


Negative impacts of Whaling on the Environment

Anti-Whaling


- Strict stance on cruel and unnecessary whaling

Commercial


- Done for oil, meat, whalebone research
- Japan, Norway, Iceland





Oceans ability to store Carbon

- Estimates state that as much as 400,000 tons of carbon are extracted from the air due to these whales each year!








Unbalancing the food Chain
