### 4 Necessary Conditions for Decision Making Capacity (DMC)

#### Patients must be able to:

- 1. Communicate choices
- 2. Understand the relevant information
- 3. Appreciate the situation and its consequences
- 4. Manipulate information rationally.

## 4. Manipulating information

- 1. life is not worth living if you become unable to mow your lawn
- 2. severe arthritis in my knees has made me unable to mow my lawn
- 3. therefore, life is not worth living.

## 4. Manipulating information

- 1. I love to run
- 2. If I have my leg amputated, I will not be able to run
- 3. If I don't have my leg amputated, I will die
- 4. I will not have my leg amputated, so that I can continue running

# Does this decisionmaker have capacity?

- 1. Life is not worth living for oranges
- 2. I am an orange
- 3. Therefore my life is not worth living

- A patient arrives in the ER unconscious
