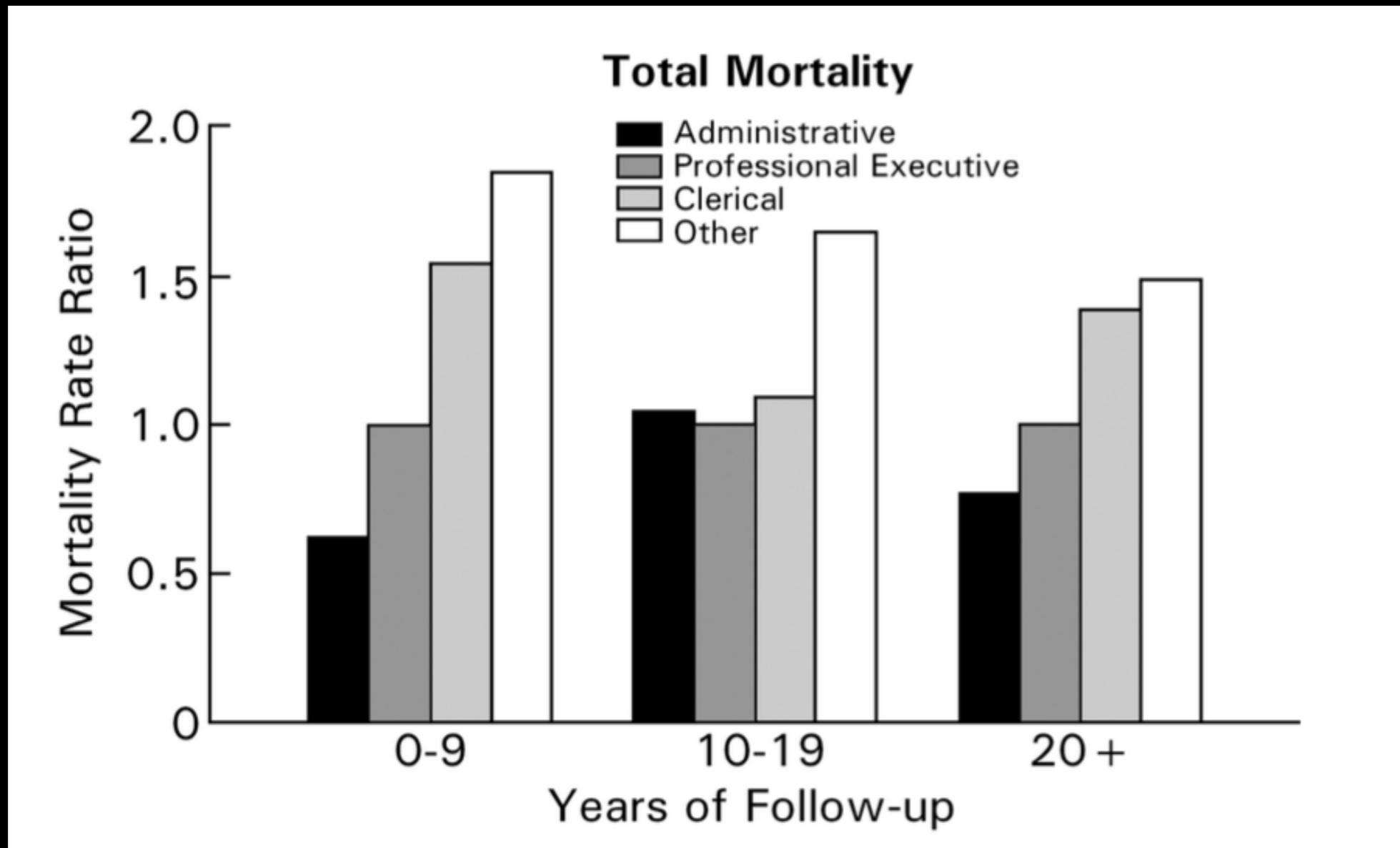
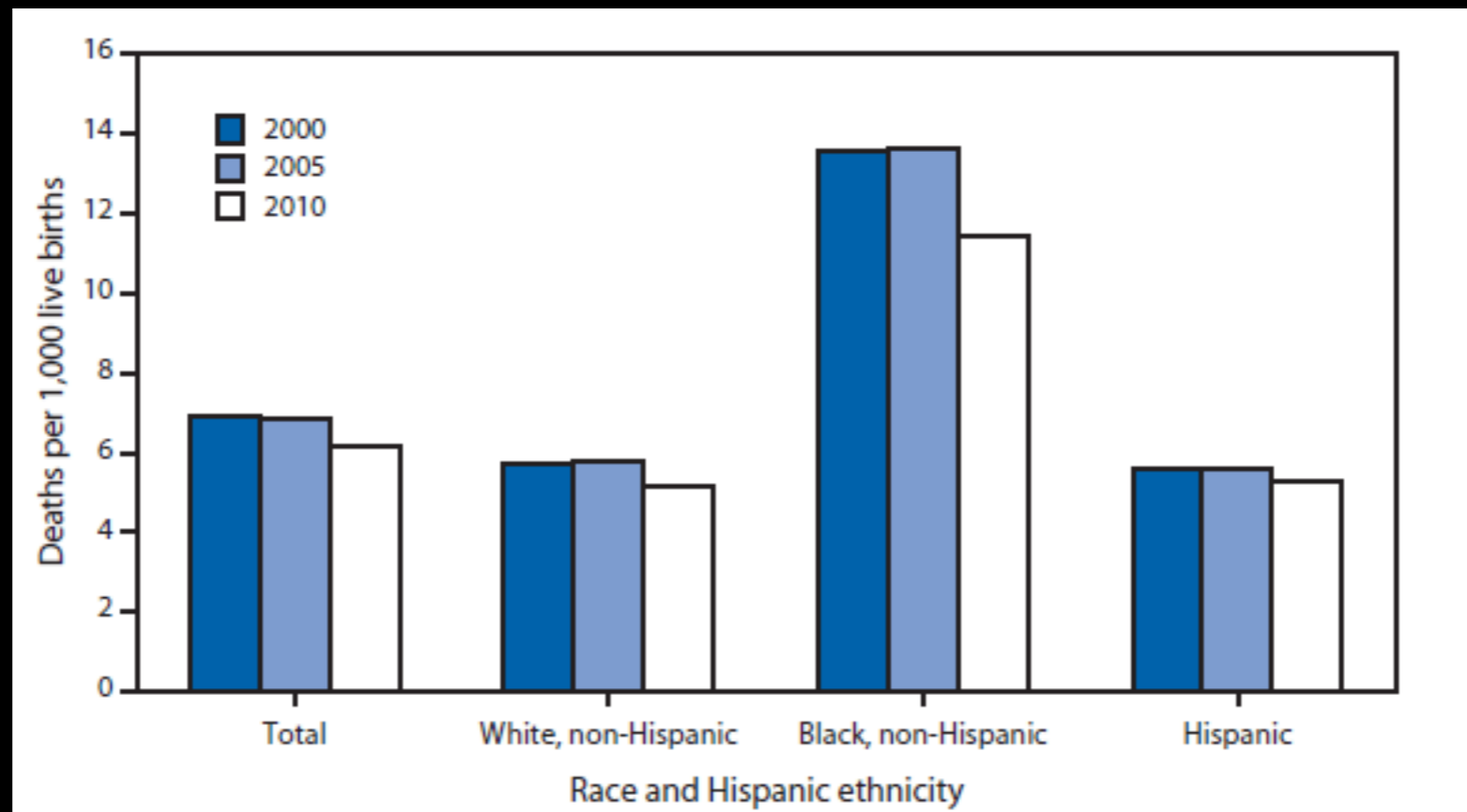

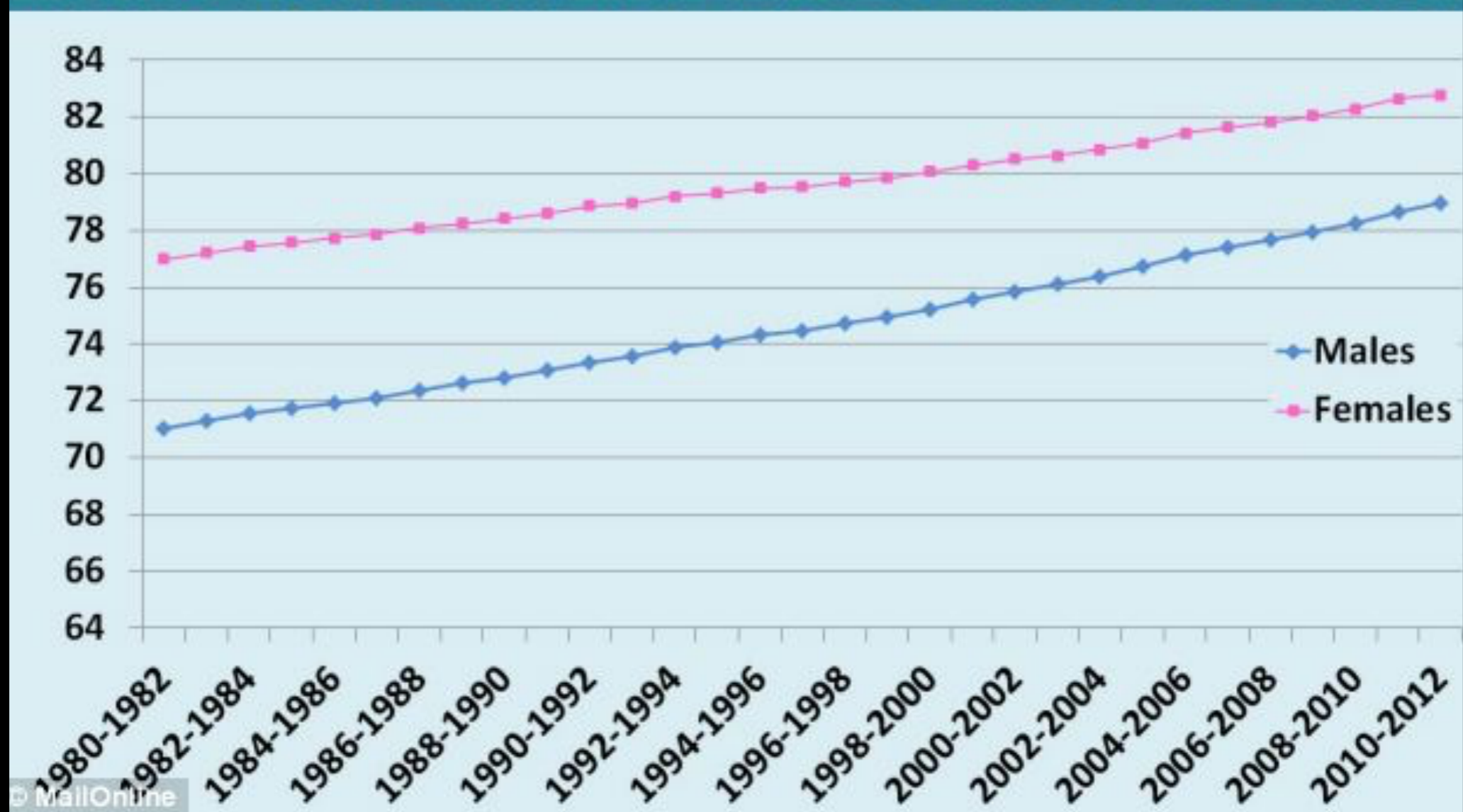

Male and Female Life Expectancy

1. To each person whatever health is acquired without using force or fraud
2. To each person an equal share of health
 - A. unless inequalities result from a person's own choices
 - B. even if inequalities result from a person's choices

- Affordable Care Act (2013): “Obamacare”
 - Individual and employer mandates
 - Prohibits discrimination on the basis of pre-existing conditions
 - Established state “exchanges” allowing people to buy certain pre-approved health plans
 - Provides subsidies
- American Health Care Act (2018?): Republican “repeal and replace” law.
 - Remove individual and employer mandates
 - Also prohibits discrimination on the basis of pre-existing conditions. Allows insurance companies to impose a “penalty” for those who let their insurance lapse
 - Eliminates “exchanges”
 - Also provides subsidies to people making up to \$110,000
