Current Exhibitions

Collecting and Documenting Chinese American History October 17, 2019 - March 31, 2021

Gathering: Collecting and Documenting Chinese American History is MOCA's Fall 2019 exhibition that tells the origin story of historical societies, museums, and organized projects that document and make public the history of Chinese throughout America. The exhibition showcases the breadth, depth, and investment of organized documentation and collection of Chinese history in America.

The Chinese Helped Build the Railroad - The Railroad Helped Build America
October 17, 2019 - March 31, 2021

The Chinese Helped Build the Railroad – The Railroad Helped Build America is an historical exhibition that traces the Chinese contribution to the construction of the Transcontinental Railroad. Starting in 2012, photographer Li Ju visited sites along the route of the Transcontinental Railroad. This exhibition presents historical photographs alongside Li's contemporary images of significant railroad sites to resurrect these stories and honor the achievements of the laborers.

With a Single Step: Stories in the Making of America September 01, 2009 - December 31, 2023

With a Single Step: Stories in the Making of America presents the diverse layers of the Chinese American experience, while examining America's journey as a nation of immigrants. It interweaves the historical and political context of Chinese immigration to the United States with the personal stories and cultural traces of multiple generations to tie together three main threads:

- 1) The relationship between China and the United States; and its impact on Chinese Americans.
- 2) How Chinese Americans have perceived themselves in American society (and been perceived) over time.
- 3) The impact of Chinese Americans on American politics, culture, and life.
