hi Zheng: I would encourage you to use Think.Check.Submit <http://think.check.submit> always before submitting to a journal. More importantly, the journals you are familiar with when you do your literature review should play into where you should submit.

Without spending more than a minute, by googling the journal, it clearly is **not** predatory. It is indexed in JSTOR and published by a professional society <http://www.ajchinesestudies.org/>

do note that there is no **detailed** information about the journal's peer review process on its site which is rather lacking in detail. It only says that the journal is refereed. these are important details you will want to document.
