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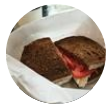

I haven't yet assigned our final research assignment, but I expect that I will have the students research some kind of debatable issue that is important to them and write an argumentative essay asserting their stance, supported by evidence found in a few sources. Another option may be to research a NYC landmark and write an essay in which they assert why they believe their chosen landmark is significant to the identity of the city. So, if you could give them some kind of overview of how to conduct that research, that would be great.
