Based on the feedback from some of you, I thought it would be helpful to share this PowerPoint about a literature review for a dissertation which may or may not be useful to you at this stage of your process.

I will address finding publishers and evaluating journals at the next workshop. Our final workshop will get into using more advanced features in Google Scholar and allow for more one-on-one guidance.

**A little more about books and interlibrary loan:**

When we search WorldCat.org, interlibrary loan services do not appear automatically although under Cite/Export, a citation manager like RefWorks can be invoked.

The "fancy" version of WorldCat <http://cityte.ch/wdc> also does not have the capability to push a book citation into our interlibrary loan platform.

**Many** books are indexed in Google Scholar but not all (I tested a few). If you have configured Google Scholar to connect to City Tech library (see the guide for the workshop referenced above), once you have a search result, you can click:

\*\*Find related info NYCCT (pushes into FindIt! menu)

\*\*\*Check the CUNY catalog first for faster, easily intra-CUNY requesting. If not available, request item via Interlibrary Loan (which you need to be set up for and logged into)

Hi Paul: Yes, we do have a group code for RefWorks. However, I'd suggest you consider using Zotero. I've switched over for my book. Zotero is free and has many, many more functionalities than RefWorks.

Our RefWorks code is RWNYCCT.

You are correct that we do not have access to ASCE content. Although we do have IEEE, this is a specialized society publisher.

My suggestion re. the ASCE content is to get an ALB card from the library and use Polytechnic/NYU's Bern Dibner library a block from here. I've been doing my work there and they have almost **\*everything\***

You can also get easy guest wifi at Dibner. Just ask for the username/password at the circulation desk when you walk in.

Alternatively, you could use interlibrary loan to get the specific items.

For the book, if you search <http://worldcat.org>, you can find it at NYPL. It is offsite, you'd need to request it in advance. Not sure if you can borrow it. A digital version is also available online.

At Staten Island, it may be in microfilm. NYU's copy doesn't seem to exist anymore. Columbia has it in Avery Library, not surprisingly. You would need to make an appointment to use the book. See <https://clio.columbia.edu/catalog/2957760>

So let me know if you're good with what I dredged up. Best, Monica

I'm glad you know about open calls and we in the library agreed that cfps that are for special issues and book chapter collections are great because you are forced to write with a deadline and a focus that the editors agree works. And yes, conference proceedings are the best intermediary step to journal publishing.
