Hi Horace: I just took a minute to read through your list. I feel some of these topics should be covered by you. It is also challenging that I don't have a copy of your syllabus. It would make a big difference as you are asking me to teach more than how to use the library. Also, I only will teach 90 minutes and teaching search strategy and using the library takes time.

1. Identifying a practical and workable topic. **YES, PRESUME YOU HAVE OR WILL ALSO TEACH THAT Conducting a Research. THAT DEPENDS ON HOW YOU DEFINE RESEARCH. DO YOU MEAN A LITERATURE REVIEW OR ORIGINAL RESEARCH?**
2. Selecting a topic. **YES (redundant, see #1)**
3. Distinguishing between the research subject and the topic. **DO YOU MEAN SUBJECT LITERALLY AS IN A RESEARCH SUBJECT OR SUBJECT MATTER.** I presume you mean that a topic is more complex than a subject. This is also content that is usually taught by the classroom instructor.
4. Constructing a thesis / the research problem. **YES, PRESUME YOU HAVE OR WILL ALSO TEACH THAT**
5. Using the library database and the internet. **YES**
6. The difference between narrative, informational and expository writing. **NOT TAUGHT BY LIBRARIANS**
