During his time in school, Joseph was able to put out his first EP "Divisions of Society", where he took on all the writing and recording all the music with a producer and vocalist. Joseph aims to keep making music and videos for his band and all other artists as a passion and career path.

As a musician and visual artist, Adriano Vasquez has spent years developing his skills finding new forms of artistic expression. Versatile in electric guitar and Bass guitar, he has explored an eclectic variety of genres ranging from blues rock to metal.
