



## **OER Evaluation Criteria**

- 1. **Content** OER content has been selected for its academic and pedagogical value, relevance, and accuracy
- 2. **Comprehensiveness** The OER covers all areas and concepts in the course
- 3. **Attribution** OER content complies with intellectual property law and permission guidelines; authorship and licensing permissions are readily displayed in the OER
- 4. **Organization** The OER is presented in a clear, consistent, and contextualized manner that supports instruction and learning
- 5. **Accessibility** The OER is accessible to students and the broader public via a variety of devices, and meets ADA web standards
- 6. **Navigation** The OER is free of navigational problems, image distortions, or broken links
- 7. **Modularity** Components of the OER can easily be incorporated into stand-alone contexts that facilitate re-mixing and re-use
- 8. **Cultural relevance** The OER is culturally sensitive. It should make use of examples that are inclusive of a variety of races, ethnicities, and backgrounds
