The special effects used in the film paved the way for future sci-fi films, and became very popular after its release" (Wagner). on what was being filmed. For example in the 1950s "Developments of the atomic bomb and anxiety about apocalyptic effects of a nuclear war strongly influenced the sci-fi genre during the 50s" (Wagner).
