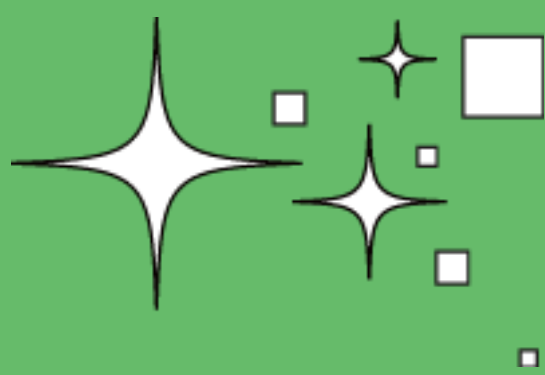


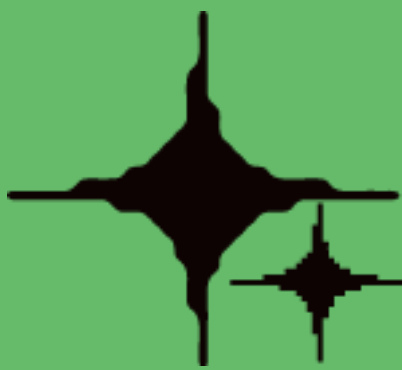

WHAT IS IT ?

RELEVANCY

Redlining is a discriminatory practice in which services are withheld from potential customers who reside in neighborhoods classified as "hazardous" to investment; these neighborhoods have significant numbers of racial and ethnic minorities, and low-income residents.

While this occurred back in the 1930's it is safe to say that its effects still linger. From people stilling using red lining map in real estate to

Starting in the 1930s, the government-sponsored Home Owners' Loan Corporation and the Federal Home Loan Bank Board used these maps to deny lending and investment services to Black Americans.

Redlining was banned under the Fair Housing Act of 1968.

More Recently we see institutions still using redlining maps to gage their future plans. the effects of red lining is so deep that places like Chicago are still recovering.

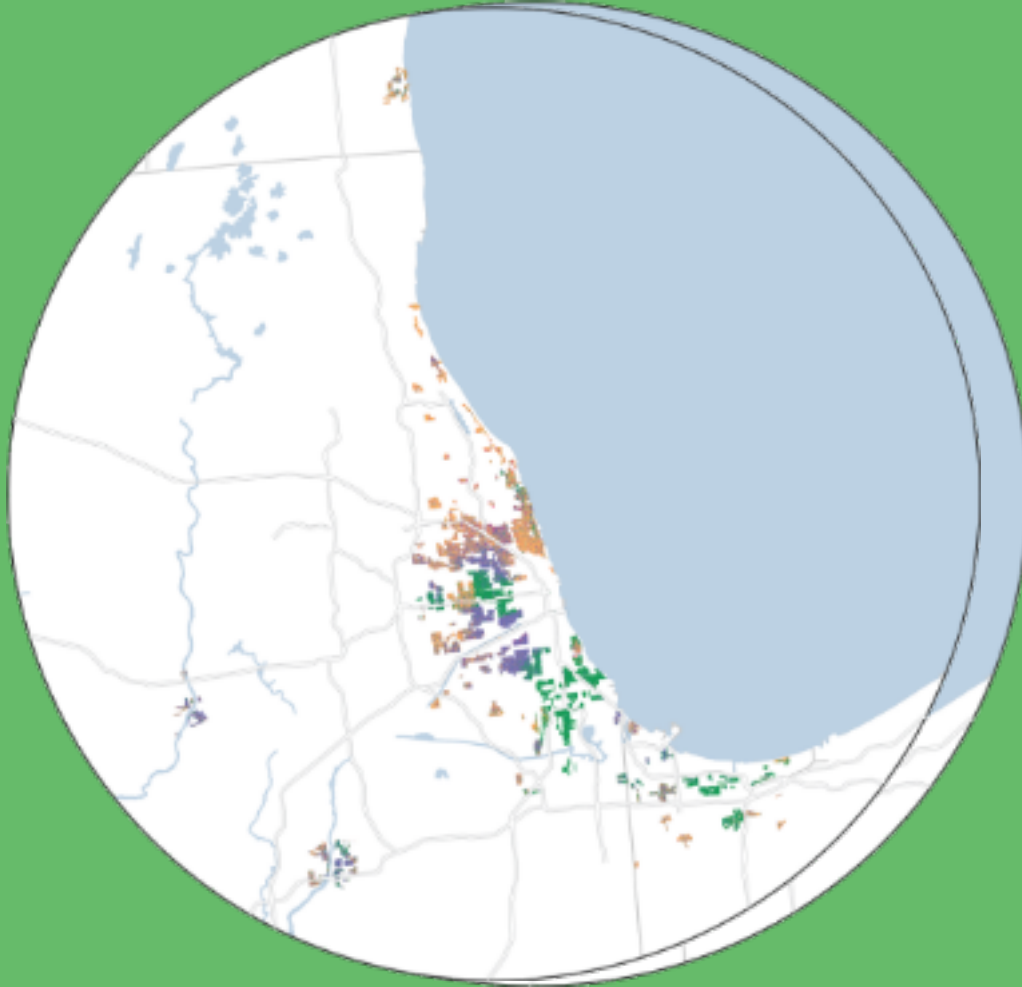
