- What Causes Mass Shootings in the United States?
- Mass shootings are more common in the U.S. than in any other country.
- These tragic events bring suffering to our communities.
- About 30% of the world's mass shootings happen in the U.S.
- Mental health is considered one of the main causes.
- However, gun ownership is considered by many as the main cause of these tragedies.
- It is considerably easier to get a gun in the U.S. than in other countries.
- 31% of all households in the U.S. have firearms.
- Firearms are responsible for more than 31 000 deaths and an estimated 74 000 nonfatal injuries among US residents each year.
- This includes mass shootings casualties.
- The relationship between gun ownership and mass shootings seems very clear.
- By changing gun regulations and improving mental health, we can end gun violence.
