
RACISM ON MEXICANS



HISPANICS HAVE A HARDER TIME GETTING APPROVED FOR CONVENTIONAL MORTGAGES THAN WHITES AND ASIANS, AND WHEN THEY ARE APPROVED THEY TEND TO PAY HIGHER INTEREST RATES.



32% OF LATINOS WITH DARKER SKIN SAY SOMEONE TOLD THEM TO GO BACK TO THEIR COUNTRY WHILE 20% OF THOSE WITH LIGHTER SKIN WERE TOLD THAT SAME THING

Hispanics with darker skin more likely to experience discrimination incidents than those with lighter skin

Note: Skin color is self-assessed based on a 10-step color scale, ranging from lightest (1) to darkest (10). Respondents with lighter skin selected 1-4 on the scale when identifying their skin color while respondents with darker skin selected 5-10.
