different racial groups. 68% of whites have a favorable view towards police while 40% of African Americans have a favorable view towards police. Seventy-three percent of African-Americans are more quick to say that police officers use lethal force [force that could cause serious body injury or death] than thirty-five percent of whites. African-Americans are most likely to say this because they possibly could've had more experience with officers using deadly force against them or they know someone who had deadly force used on them. Also, most people say they had positive experiences with police officers while the others who didn't were most likely black, and Hispanic.
