COM 1403: Philosophy of Healthcare Project Part 3: The Presentation

Your in-class POH presentation is a visual and spoken demonstration of your written POH.

- Your Philosophy of Healthcare (POH) project is made up of several parts:
 - Draft of POH
 - Final version of POH
 - Presentation of POH
- Now, we will focus on the **presentation of your POH.**
- Your audience should walk away from your presentation knowing what you believe, value, and are inspired by in the healthcare field. As long as you complete this goal, the particular information that you decide to include in your POH presentation is up to you.
- You can also talk about the **process of writing** your POH—tell us what you struggled with, what inspired your thinking, how your ideas changed from the draft to the final version, how the interview project influenced your philosophy, etc.
- You are **required** to create a PowerPoint/Slides presentation for this project.
 - You must have at least 4 slides for this: (1) title slide, (2) introductory slide, (3) main points, (4) concluding slide.
 - Your slides must be well organized, legible, and effective overall.
- You will be graded on both content and delivery. This means you will be graded on the information you include in your presentation, as well as your public speaking skills.
- Your presentation must be 6-8 minutes long.
- You will be assigned one of the following presentation dates: **November 30**th, **December 5**th, **December 14**th, **or December 19**th. If you know you will be absent on any of these dates, notify me ASAP via email.
 - Attendance is required on all presentation dates, even when you are not presenting.
- Your slides are due on Blackboard at the start of class on **Tuesday, November 28**th, regardless of which presentation date you are assigned. Note that this is the same due date as your final POH paper. Please note: the due date and first presentation date have been updated since our original syllabus and assigned were distributed.
