


Original Story

"You pretend to read the future in the stars, and yet you fail to see what is at your feet! This may teach you to pay more attention to what is right in front of you, and let the future take care of itself."


"What use is it," said another, "to read the stars, when you can't see what's right here on the earth?"

Project proposal



However, on one night of his usual walks, he is so distracted looking up at the sky as he walks that he fails to notice his surroundings and falls into a well full of mud and water. His screams when falling alerted the villagers - neighbors - and they came running to help. They helped pull him out of the well as one of them said: "You pretend to read the future in the stars, and yet you fail to see what is at your feet! This may teach you to pay more attention to what is right in front of you and let the future take care of itself." 

Character Design






















