
Kenzo Takada

- Japanese fashion designer who is best known for his label "KENZO"
- Went to "Tokyo Bunka Fashion College" and studied fashion. There were around 60 women and 10 boys including himself in the class.
- In 1960 he won the prestigious Soen prize and began working for the Sanaa department store as a designer of girls clothing.
- Then in 1970 he opened his first Boutique called "jungle jap" and his
 - designs featured in American vogue in 1971.
- Retired in 1999, Then started making furniture for high end Furniture store "Roche Bobois"

- Jeremy Scott, an American designer hailing from Kansas City, Missouri,
 was born on August 8th, 1975.
- Moved to New York and went to Pratt Institute, in his senior year he
 interned for MOSCHINO in the PR department. (1996). In 1997 he
