I used a white cropped cotton ribbed tank top to express my identity and the role I play in society. I gathered several arts and crafts such as light pink acrylic paint, a block printing stamp, pearls, sparkly baby pink ribbon, and neon pink fur! I cut an old fur boa and formed a heart that was placed directly in the middle of the shirt. This heart signifies my love for all people and my willingness to help others as much as possible. My mother was adamant on being a "cheerful giver" and lending a helping hand in any way possible when others were in need. Surrounded by this generosity and compassion, I make it my mission to change one life at a time. Whether it's a donation, food, a compliment, prayer, or support, someone out there needs it. This heart in the middle of my shirt portrays just that. On the back of the shirt, I added the traditional peace sign

logo in a beautiful neon pink. This symbol was stamped using the block printing method and is a direct reflection of my dreams I have in the world. Imagine a planet of pure peace, more love, more conversation, more hope, more courage, more integrity, and more compassion. Although I fail at times, I try my hardest to remain at peace and spread peace despite adversity. Two sparkly baby pink ribbons *adhered* to the shoulder strap and the bottom seam is bejeweled with pearls (Eicher & Roach-Higgins, 1992). The gorgeous pink hues and pearl beads emphasize my girly aesthetic and true love for the color. Pink expresses my femininity and the power that lies within me. The color makes me feel confident and unstoppable, yet soft and innocent. The pearls lined along the seam pay homage to my mom and grandmother, two of my biggest inspirations who have assisted in molding the woman I am today. A small pin that reads "righteous" was *clipped* onto the back of the shirt which expresses my *identity* through spirituality (Eicher & Roach-Higgins, 1992).
