BACKGROUND INFO

- ★ Born February 11, 1934 in London
- ★ Self taught designer & designed for herself since 1950s
- ★ Was influenced by Chelsea Beatniks and dance outfits from her childhood
- ★ Parents refused to let her attend a fashion school
- ★ Studied illustration in Goldsmiths College and got her diploma in art education in 1953



HOW SUCCESS STARTED

- ★ Opened Bazaar which was a boutique in 1955 in collaboration with Alexander Plunket Greene and Archie McNair
- ★ Started designing because she found it difficult to find clothing she wanted to sell
- ★ Introduced the "mod" era and "Chelsea" look
- ★ Opened second boutique in Knightsbridge London in 1957 (closed in 1969)

WHAT SHE DID AS A DESIGNER

- ★ Invented mini skirt/dress
- ★ Transformed cosmetics by introducing tights undergarments, rainwear, shoes and boots
- ★ Created longer silhouettes in 1969/70
- ★ Had the daisy logo on her garments
- ★ Worked with plastic
- ★ Made summer designs in winter weight fabrics



FIRST DESIGNS

- ★ In 1958, created a three-piece outfit in grey flannel
- ★ Included a hat, knickerbockers and a tunic-style shift
- ★ Men's cardigans long enough to wear as dresses
- ★ White plastic collars used to brighten up sweaters and dresses

DEPARTMENT STORES & CHEAPER LINE

- ★ In 1962, she signed a design contract with American Department store JCPenney
- ★ In 1963, company Mary Quant Limited expanded into the UK market with a cheaper line called Ginger Group

- ★ Made in Great Britain in 1964-65
- ★ Materials and Techniques: machine stitched PVC, woven cotton and copper alloy buttons
- ★ Has a turn down 'Christopher Robin' collar
- ★ Took two years of manufacturing
- ★ Accession number: T.3-2013

- ★ Skirt Suit
- ★ Designed in 1962, made in 1973
- ★ Aimed for women wh needed smart, comfortable work clothes
- ★ Made out of wool
- ★ Edge to edge jacket with pie crust fill around collar
- ★ Accession Number: T.104 to D-1976




- ★ Ankle Boots


