Born August 20th, **1951** in San Diego, California


Died November 19th, **2022** (71)

He received his Bachelor of Arts from San Diego University




Hard Science Fiction





Blood Music (published in 1985) is one of his most notable works















Ray Bradbury

Bear co-wrote a screenplay for Bradbury's "A Sound of Thunder" (which was ultimately never adapted to a film).

Bear attended many of Bradbury's lectures, and in 1967 he gave him a copy of the screenplay.

Bradbury and Bear built a long lasting friendship, and had frequent correspondence.



Other series

Bear wrote for books that expand established universes such as: Star Wars, Star Trek, Halo & Asimov's Foundation.
