## **Introduction & Purpose\***

Academic advisement represents an essential part in any educational achievement. Upon entering college, students should be aware of all the potential areas of resources at their disposal in order to best plan their course of studies and navigate a path to graduation. In addition to faculty advisers, degree audits, catalogues, and peer advice, the academic advisement webpage is one of the most valuable and readily accessible resource available to students in need of academic advisement.

New York City College of Technology (CityTech) students from four Student Ready Departments Hospitality Management, Computer Engineering Technology, Health Services Administration, Construction Management and Civil Engineering Technology participated in a survey to determine the effective use of the academic advisement webpage. Participants ranged from first-year students to fourth-year students.

The objective of this survey was to bring awareness of the academic advising resources and tolls available to students on the academic advisement, to elicit the willingness of participants to recommend these resources to other students, and to determine the likelihood of students using these resources in the future.

The Office of the Provost provided participants with a presentation of the Academic Advisement Webpage and then asked them to evaluate the tools and resources on the webpage. Following the presentation, participants were given a link to a survey (via Google Forms). Participants were asked about their knowledge and willingness to share information about the tools and resources available on the page.

In Fall 2018, approximately 120 students were surveyed. Ninety-four (94) responded, representing a seventy-eight percent (78%) response rate.

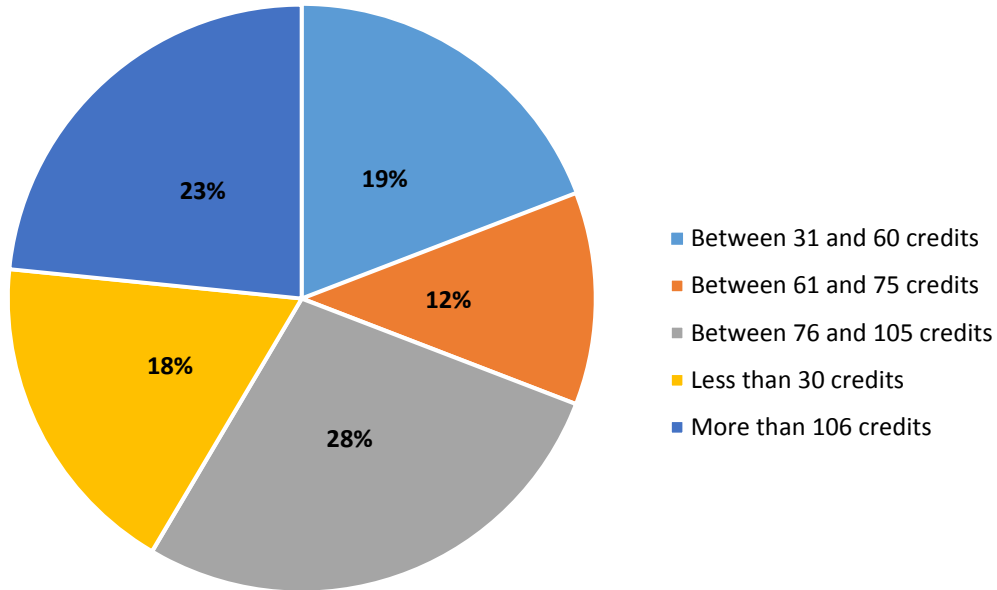
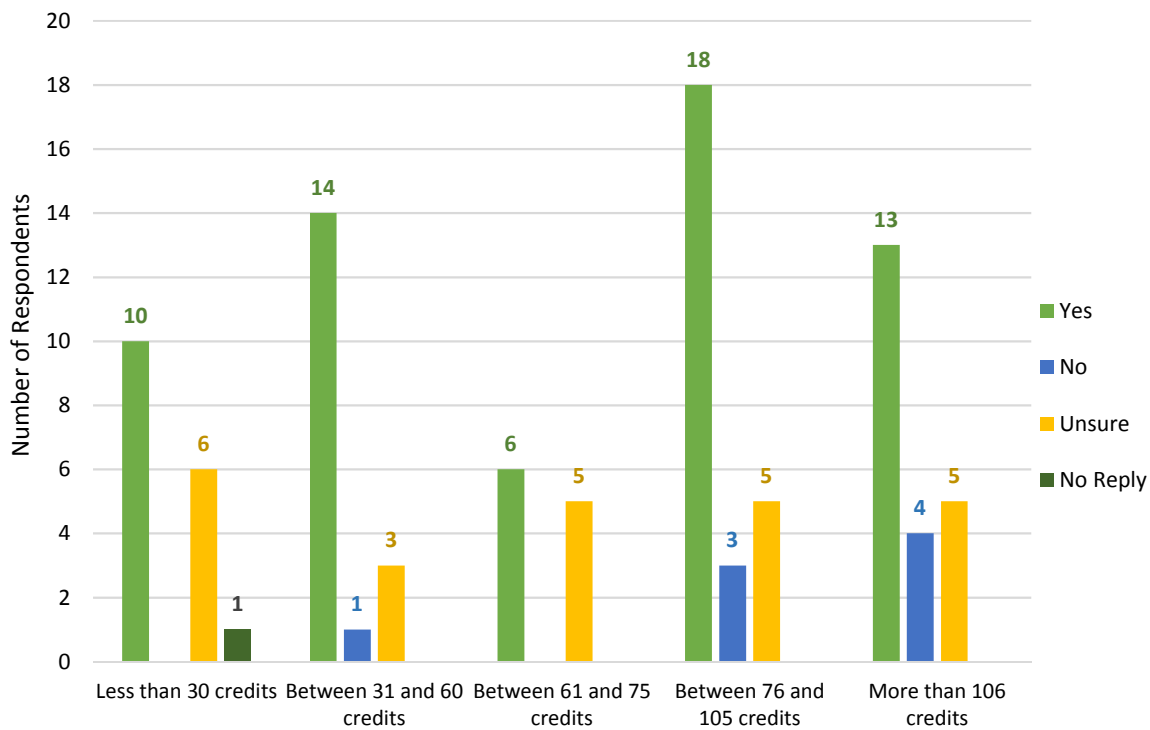
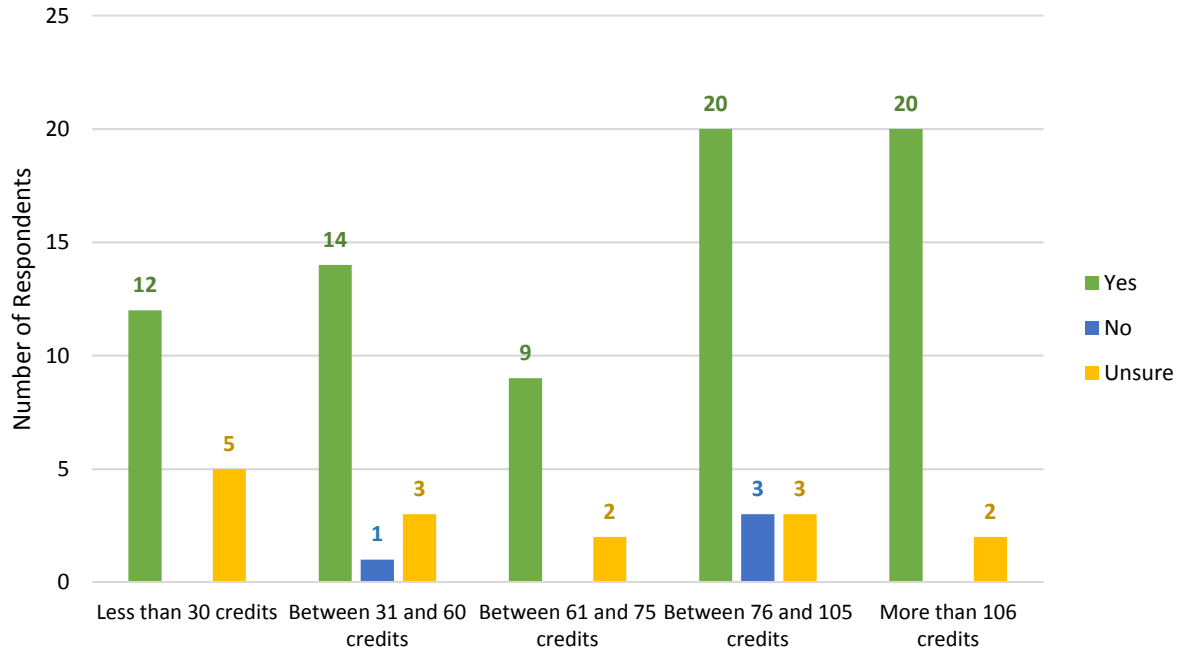


Figure 2. Do you believe you will use the degree checklist in the future?

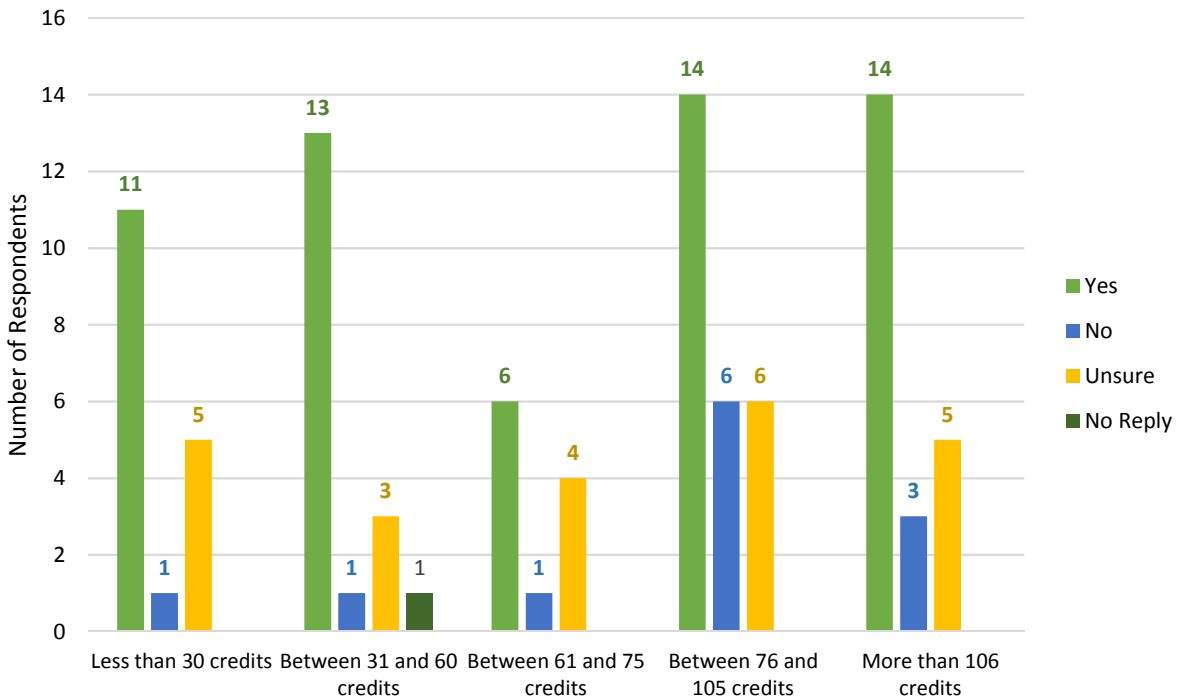




**Figure 3. Do you believe you would recommend the degree checklist to other students?**

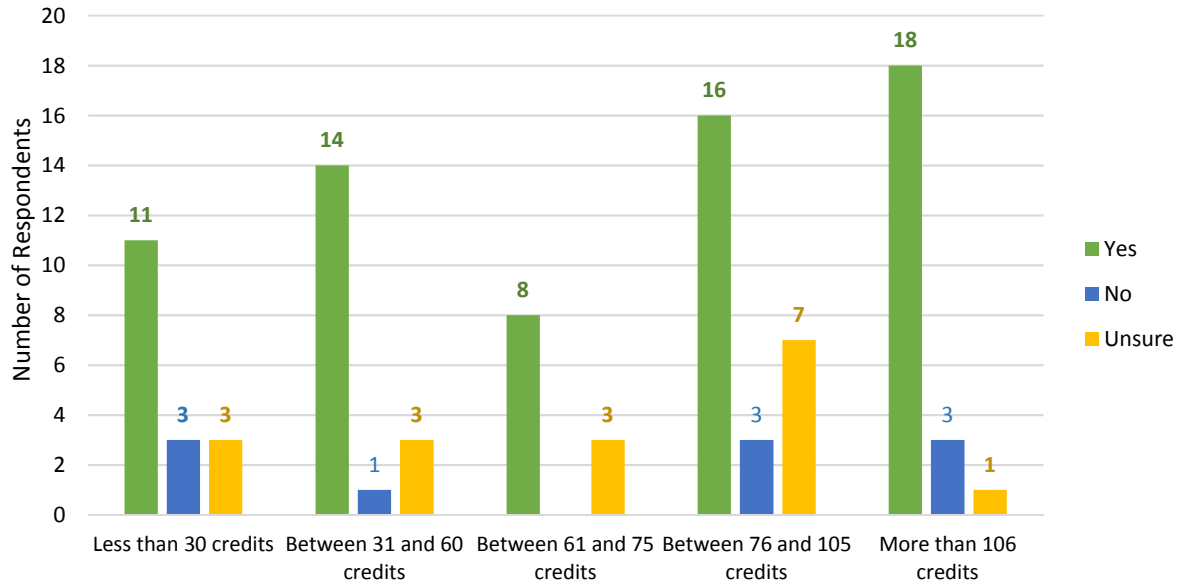


**Figure 4. Do you believe you will use the "My Academic Planner" in the future?**

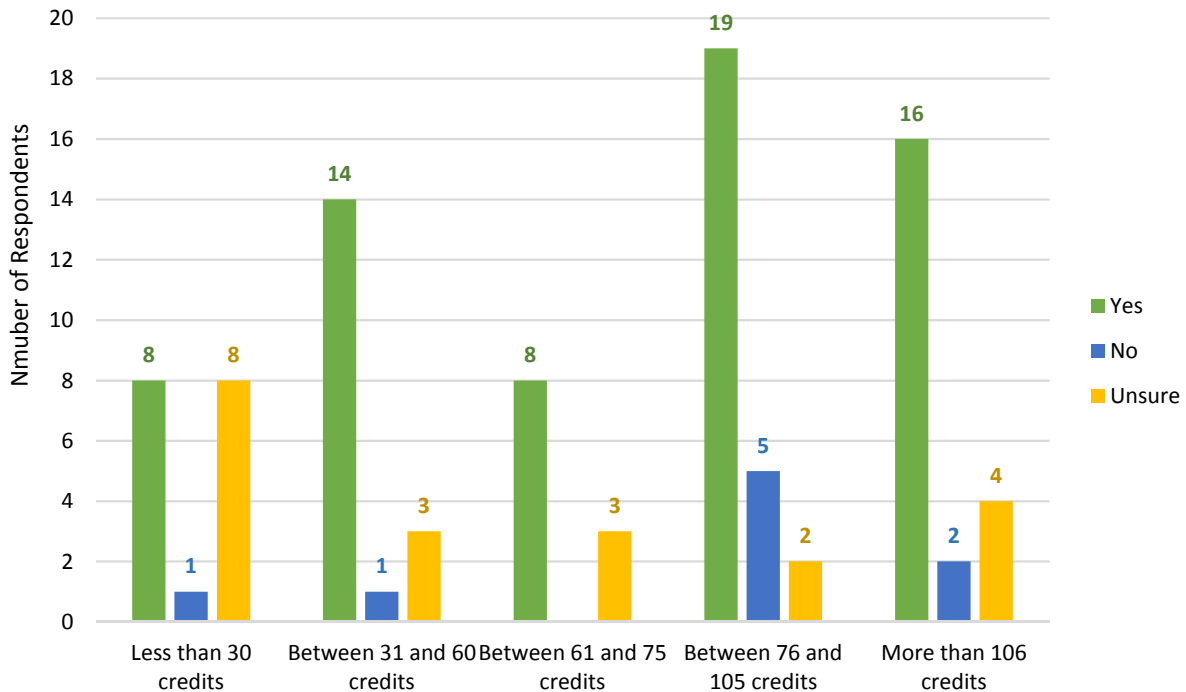




**Figure 5. Do you believe you would recommend "My Academic Planner" to other students?**

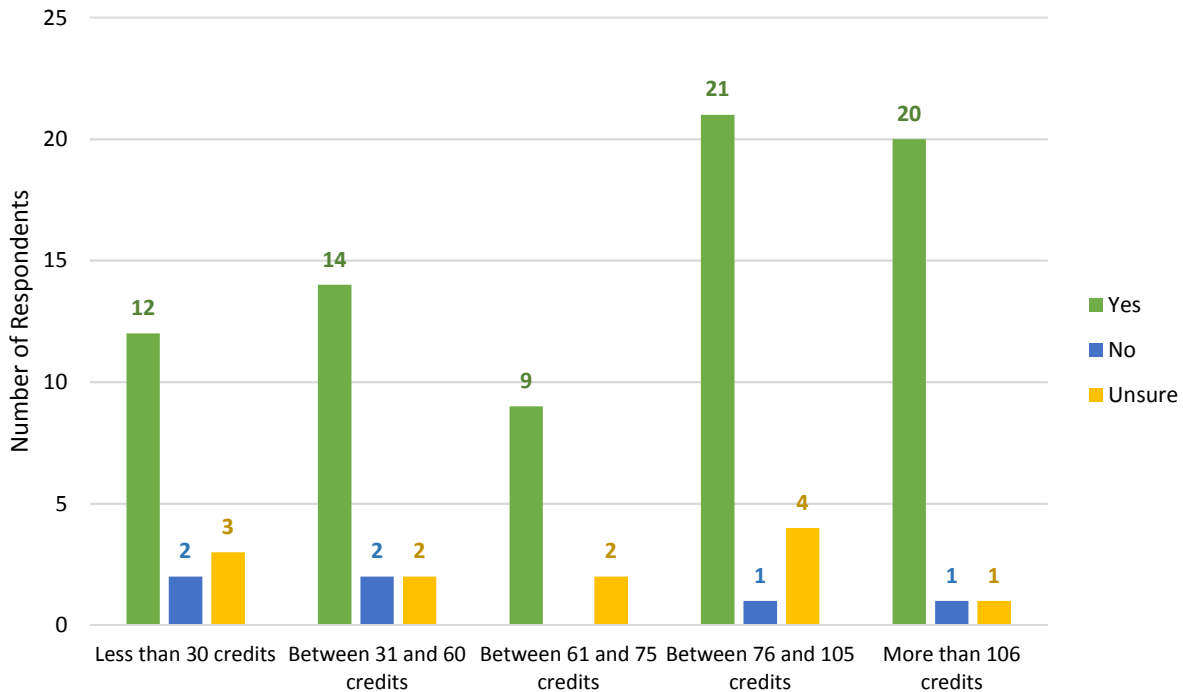


**Figure 6. Do you believe you will use the academic advising webpage in the future?**
