Exports and imports such as transportation, machines, and chemical products are some of the leading trades the two countries do with one another (OEC, 2020). When it comes to E-commerce, France has the seventh largest market with a revenue of about \$70 billion (EcommerceDB, 2021). As their E-commerce continues to grow so does their imports and export which in turn helps support France's overall economy.

French politics may be as interesting as it has been in decades. France is a democracy, whose head of state is the French President, who appoints the Prime Minister as head of government. France is going through a bit of an identity crisis politically, as Macron is the incumbent president of France. Was elected by spearheading a political movement of his own. Macron is facing the fact of losing his parliamentary majority in legislative elections this weekend according to CNN. Prime Minister Elisabeth Borne, though she survived, faced a vote of no confidence, and to further complicate the situation in France. According to CNBC Macron only came out on top among older voters (McGee, Turak, ALJAZEERA, 2022). With all that being considered France has a strong relationship with its European allies. France, bordered by Spain, Italy, Switzerland, Germany, and Belgium (Louis-René Higonnet, 2022). Trades mostly with its EU neighbors, 54% of France's exports go to countries in the EU. Germany 15%, Italy 8% and Belgium and Spain 7% (Europpa, 2022). France is also a member of the G7 and NATO. Germany is not France's biggest trading partner by accident, French is Germany's most important partner in the EU (Auswaertiges, 2022). Italy and France have a strong relationship being

founding members of the EU. France and Italy also share cultural and historical ties (Ministère de l'Europe et des Affaires étrangères, 2019). Recently France and Spain signed a bilateral agreement establishing symmetry in Spain and France on their treatment of dual nationality (Exteriores, 2022).

The largest country in Europe, also referred to as the hexagon, is France. Despite being the largest country, France is the 3rd leading country when it comes to textile sales, slightly behind Germany and Italy (Madison, Bizvibe, 2021). France accounts for 10% of textile jobs and over 12% of net textile and garment expenditures in Europe (Bizvibe, 2019). In France, priority has also surged for various creative and expensive textile products as well as synthetic fabrics, which today make up 15% of the market (Bizvibe, 2019). One of the extremely important textiles in this category is linen, which is nowadays produced in Europe to a 70% extent (Madison, 2021). Despite the Covid pandemic, France manages to hold a strong position in the global market (Blancheton, 2021).

Finally, when one looks at France's economy you can see it is one of the strongest economies in Europe. However, all of Europe's currency recently took a hit as the parity to the U.S. Dollar is as close as it has been in decades. Nonetheless, France rebounded strongly in 2021, with real GDP projected to grow to 2.4% in 2022 and 1.4% in 2023. While this is not as high as they'd like, many other countries are at negative GDP growth due to the Covid-19 pandemic (OECD, 2022). Inflation is expected to reach 5% in 2023, which is much less compared to America. They were able to do so as the government passed a 25 billion euro package to put caps on gas and electricity price increases (France24, 2022). Moreover, President Macron has indicated that he will increase pensions and subsidies to the poor. While the global

economy is not in great shape right now, France has done a good job of ensuring that their economy continues to move forward (Al Jazeera, 2022).
