
Circular Path

Vertical Path

If it is necessary to use a vertical path. IT is best to create a regular horizontal text box, then flip 90 degrees.

Type reads best when the starts of the words is at the top.

Note that there are some exceptions. For example logotypes or signage.

Make it better

There are ways to fix these issues:

Control the curves

zemember, that the designer can adjust the curves

Make adjustments to type size and typeface.
