



General Education Committee Scope of Work: Its role is to frame the goals and desired outcomes of General Education and coordinate all of the Gen Ed work going on at the college under one umbrella. Faculty department liaisons are members of working groups that support, coordinate, represent, and demonstrate Gen Ed learning goals/outcomes and promote its integration within each discipline.

First Year Experience Committee Scope of Work: Faculty liaisons work at the department and college-wide levels with Student Affairs to enhance the new student orientation process—working together from the moment students are accepted into the college through their first year experience. Focused questions drive the work: How does a student become a learner? What curricular/co-curricular support and opportunities engage students? Why focus efforts on the first year experience?
