## Assignment #6

Vocabulary:

<u>Clerestory</u>- Upperpart of the naive, choir, and transepts of a large church containing a series of windows. It is clear of the roofs of the aisles and admits light to the central parts of the building. <u>Triforium</u>- is an interior gallery, opening onto the tall central space of a building at an upper level

Gallery- any covered passage that is open at one side

<u>Aisle</u>- passage way to either side of the nave that is separated from the nave by colonnades or arcades

<u>Arcade</u>- a covered passageway with arches along one or both sides

<u>Flyer</u>- the outdoor semi-arch support connects with buttress to the main structure

Buttress- a projecting support of stone (brick built against a wall)

<u>Crypt</u>- an underground room or vault beneath a church/a stone chamber beneath the floor of a church

Rose Window- large circular stained glass windows found in gothic churches

<u>Lancet</u>- is a variety of pointed arch in which each of the arcs, or curves, of the arch have a radius longer than the width of the arch

<u>Tracery</u>- is the stonework elements that support the glass in a gothic window

Quadripartite- a groined vault over a rectangular area, the area defined by ribs on each side and divided into four parts by intersecting diagonals.
