Final Reflection

This past semester in ENG 1121, I have gained experience as a writer, and I am blown away by the progress I have made since the beginning of the semester until now. My experience in this class has taught me that I am a very creative reader and writer, which enables me to avoid the challenge of being stuck with no idea what to write. My ability to form sentences rapidly also allows me to complete my work more quickly since I am full of ideas. My strategy consists of having a broad outline of what I am going to write in each paragraph or sentence before I begin the essay. If anything needs to be changed, my ability to improvise is also considered a skill because of my ability to adjust quickly. Another takeaway from this class that I acknowledged was the use of Al. Al is a very important feature in today's world, and most professors despise and forbid the use of it. Professor Cipriani, on the other hand, promotes to us that we should use Al for all our work because it will be part of the future and we must adapt to it sooner rather than later. If God is Willing

Growing up in an Arab household, my parents, who were born and raised in Palestine, always spoke Arabic to my brothers and me, and even though we barely spoke the language, we understood what they were saying most of the time but still chose to reply with English. The one word that grew on me throughout my childhood was the saying, Inshallah.

Inshallah means if God is willing in English. Every single person who speaks Arabic and is Islamic says, Inshallah, after everything they do to show they are thankful for everything, they leave everything up to God to decide. Inshallah is usually said when something is asked about in the future. Recently, my mother taught me that it is important as a Muslim to say this word, as it will provide great fortune for those who say it. Growing up, my parents, especially my mother, would always say no when I asked for something, and every time she gave me the answer, inshallah, I would always see it as another saying for no. Growing up, I never liked it, inshallah, because I felt like it was another way for my mother to say no and make me believe she would do whatever I asked of her. I remember, as a child, I wanted a game so bad that I begged my mom and dad for it, and when I asked, they said yes, inshallah. Being young, I did not understand the message so I was infuriated with her response and I said, Inshallah, no. She was enraged with what I said and started humbling me. It always made me confused as to why she would rather say that than a simple yes or no, but little did I know the reasoning was by far not confusing at all. The meaning has changed over time for me and made me realize that everything is in God's hands. I recently started saying, inshallah, a lot when I went back to Palestine this summer and spoke Arabic mainly to communicate with my family. Over the past

couple of months, I have gotten accustomed to saying I get asked questions that have something to do with my future.

Inshallah can correctly indicate if someone is Muslim because it shows they only believe in one god, and that is Allah (god in Arabic). When you believe that everything is up to God to decide, that makes you a Muslim because you dedicate your life to him and believe he paves the way for everyone. So when hearing someone say Inshallah when spoken to, you can automatically determine that this person has dedicated their beliefs to the Quran and has full trust and faith in God. Those who can say inshallah are those who only believe in one god, and that is Allah. As a result, if you don't believe in Allah and then say a word with his name in it, then you are considered to be mocking him. There are extremist Muslim countries that punish those who mock God through death, and this is unfortunate but true. The actions of the extremist people do not portray the actions of all, as many are against extremism, but show how far some are willing to go when their god is being used as a joke.

I was also taught as a young child to say the two words inshallah and bismillah before I go to work, school, or even outside in general, so I know that when I step out, I will be in the safest hands possible, and God will do his best to make sure my day turns out well. I'm very superstitious about it because I feel that I forget to say these prayers. I feel as if my day will be ruined and I will receive bad luck, so it makes it difficult for me to remember each time I step foot outside my house.

What I learned from these past couple assignments is that every culture, language, and even people are unique in their ways. Each culture has words that mean so much, such as Fuku, Inshallah, etc. Learning the meanings behind certain words in different languages helps you understand the background of something you are unfamiliar with and takes you into the mindset of people with different beliefs. 
