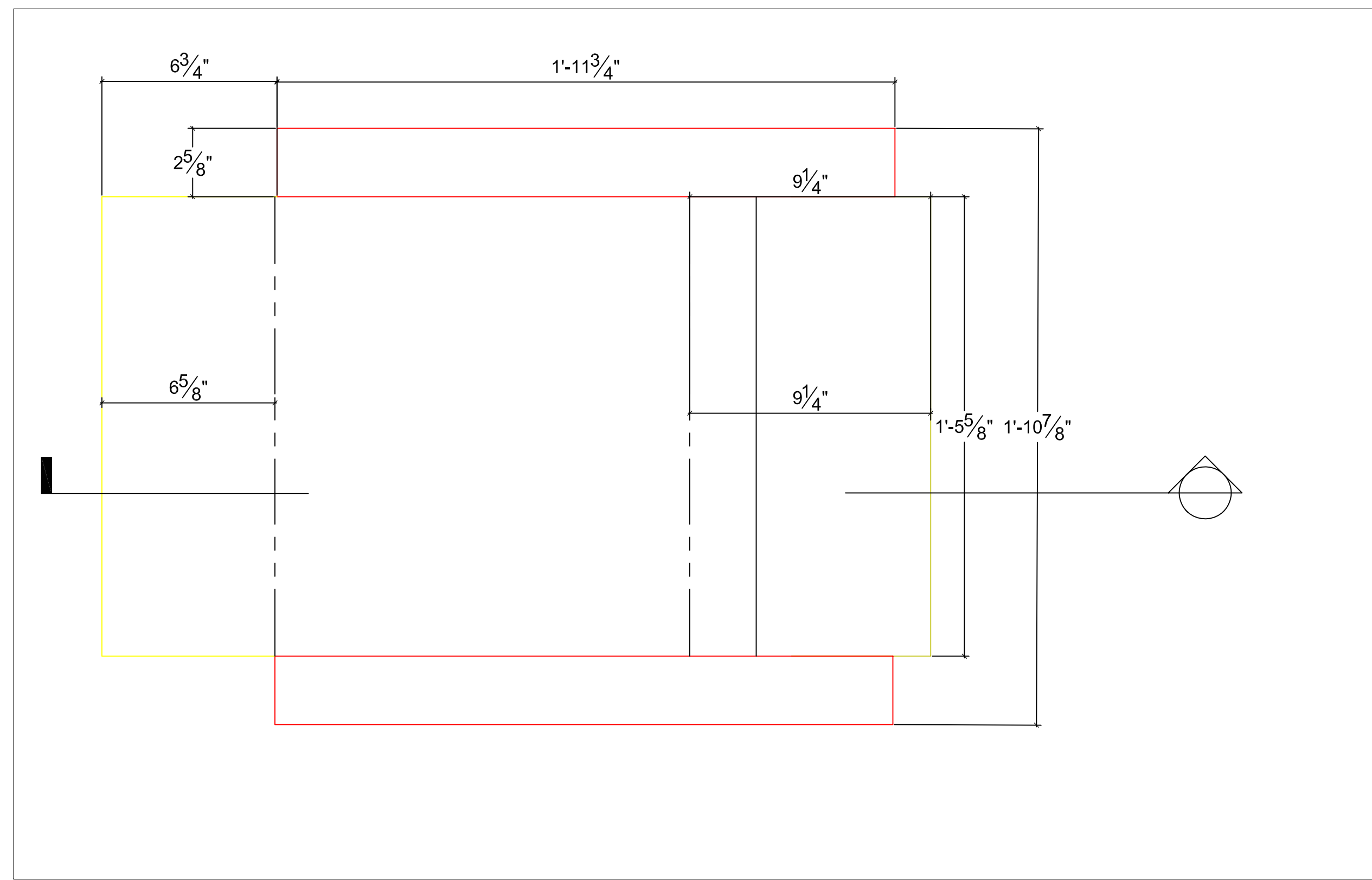
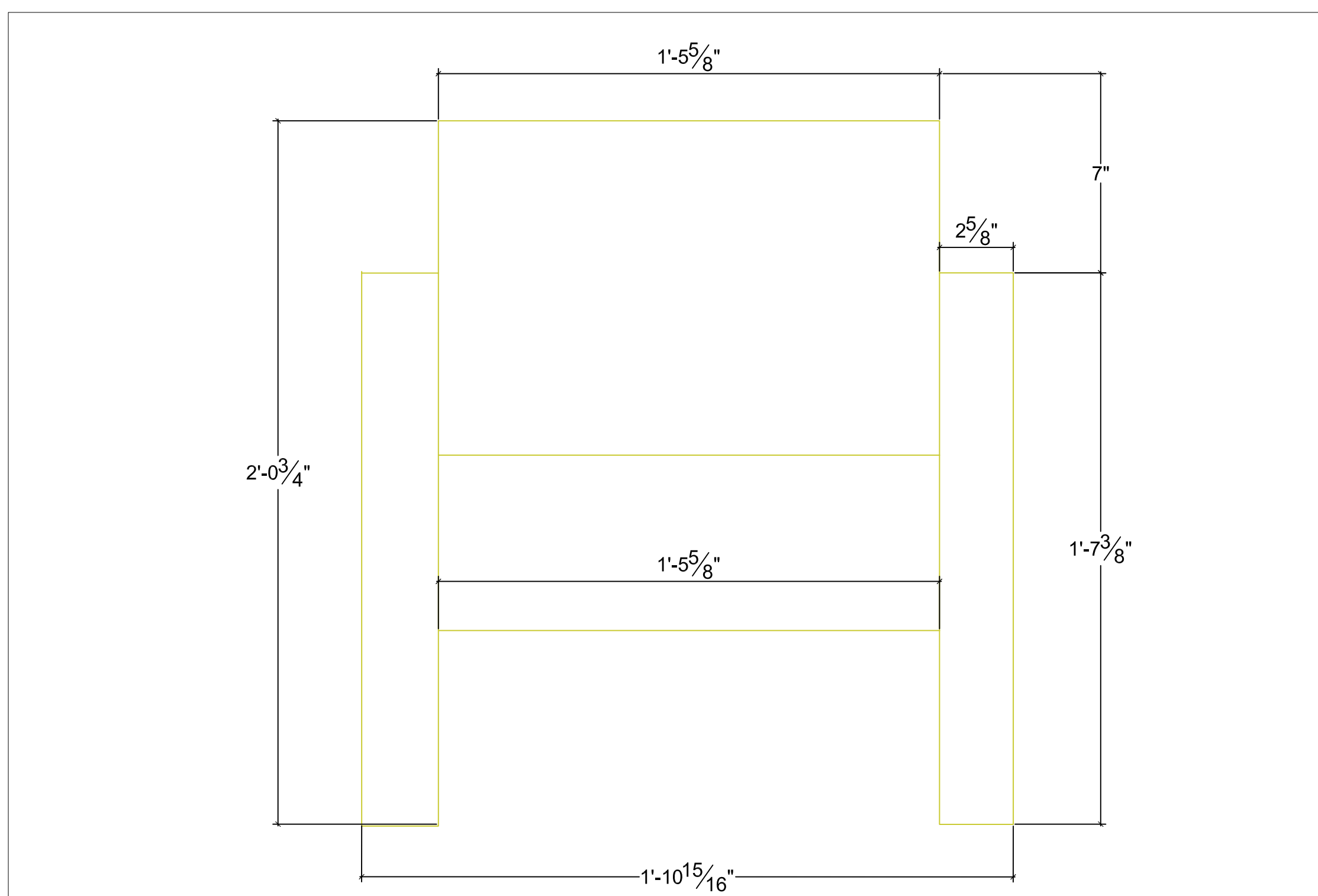


1 RENDERING
A-100.00 DRAWING SCALE (I.E. 1/4"=1'-0")

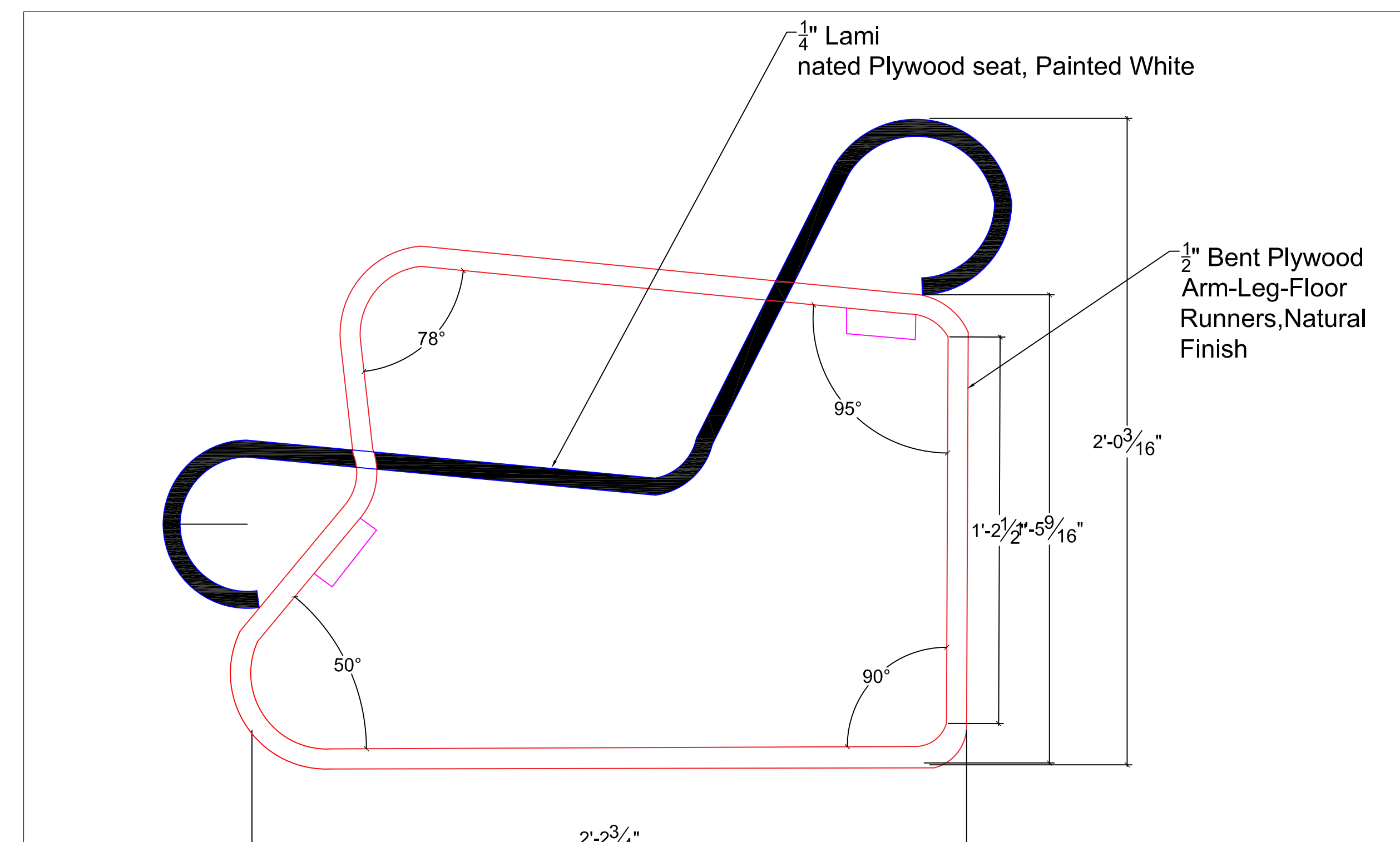


2 PLAN

this is the Paimo Lounge Chair designed by Alvar Aalto in 1931-1932. This was part of the Paimo Sanatorium in Helsinki, Finland. The essence of the chair is to allow patients to recline easier in the chair, as to help them breathe more comfortably. The lounge chair is composed of three main pieces: the seat and the two arm-leg-floor runners. The three main pieces are made of thin sheets of laminated bent plywood, either painted or left in its natural finish. Aalto was inspired by Marcel Breuer's Wassily Chair in the composition of the lounge chair.
