



Among the most beautiful natural history books ever, Markus Bloch's *Ichthyologie* presents 216 fishes, from tiny seahorses to large sharks, all drawn to fit exactly into identical boxes framing the images. Thus every fish has both a *different and unknown* scale of measurement.
