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An update on how you will be evaluated this semester:

Attendance/Participation	20%
Before March 12, 2020: Being consistently present, on time, and engaging in class discussion. This class will be run as a workshop, not a lecture course. Your presence and participation is vital. Be in class unless you have a compelling medical reason for an absence. Four absences will be forgiven at the end of the semester. After March 12, 2020: Responding to questions on the OpenLab website within 24 hours of a post. The questions will correspond with the dates/topics listed in the schedule. No "absences" in this timeframe will be forgiven.	10 points possible for each session
Critical Responses Guidelines for critical responses to your peers' work will be reviewed in class. Learning to assess your own and others' work and to offer constructive, specific feedback is a key part of our course.	10% 10 points possible for each formal response
Journal You will be keeping an online writing journal the entire semester to log your creative material and reflect on the process itself. I will be reading these entries—not to evaluate— but to ensure you are keeping up with assignments and know a little bit about what you are thinking as a writer.	20% 10 points possible for each journal assignment
Writing Throughout the semester, we will be writing memoir essays, short stories, poetry, and dialogues. You must complete each project on the due dates in order to receive points.	20% 100 points possible for each assignment
Portfolio This will be a significant revision of three major writing projects and a final reflection essay highlighting how you've evolved as a writer.	30% 100 points possible for the three writing projects and 100 points possible for the final reflection essay
