The story that never ends: why you should get into comics




Some common things you might hear when talking to someone of the comic book reading community is how the layout is constructed in a comic book, especially the artistic types in the community. Things like "Panel", "Gutter", "Tier", "Splash", and "Spread" are terms to describe how single or double pages are created in a comic book.

A Panel is a drawing on a page and contains a segment of action.


A Gutter refers to the space between panels.

A Tier is a singular row of panels. Vertical gutters can be made thinner than horizontal gutters in order to encourage the reader to group each row of panels for easier reading

A Splash is a large, ofen full-page illustration which opens and introduces a story. It's used mostly as a decorative unit and is used to establish the setting and capture the reader's attention. A spread is an image that spans more that one page

These distinct properties help navigate the reader to what order and direction the person should be reading

The most important aspect in a comic is it's editors' notes. Whenever a comic book character references something to a past issue the editor of the comic makes a small note telling the reader which comic we should go to, to get this information. Most of the time is a small text box with a little asterisk symbol (*) on a place that doesn't interfere with the overall flow of the comic.



If you want to be part of the comic book community all you have to do is choose a character from a comic book and talk about it to other people and if you really want to show your love for your charter you can buy a t-shirt to show off to everyone. If you want to join the comic book reading community either buy or read a comic book online and give your opinion to the someone who might be interested.
