It finds out where an image came from, how it is being used, if modified versions of the image exist, or if there is a higher resolution version.1" TinEye helps prevent plagiarism by providing the student and the professor a feedback report that compares an image of student work submitted through the software with a comprehensive database of links to any existing images.






2) Google Images:
