

- Is there proof of this?



¹Many people are strangely passive when they visit a doctor. ²First of all, they often fail to provide the doctor with complete information about their medical problem. 3They may barely describe their symptoms, believing that a skilled doctor—like a master car mechanic—will somehow easily be able to diagnose what is wrong with them. \*Secondly, many people fail to ask their doctors for a full and clear explanation of their condition. They don't want to appear ignorant in front of their "all-knowing" doctor, and they don't want to take up too much of this Important Person's time, so they say little and ask almost nothing. Last of all they often fail to understand a doctor's orders. 7Studies show that many patients don't understand why they should take a certain medication or for how long they should take it. Incredibly enough, some patients are not even sure, as they are about to be rolled into an operating room, why they are having surgery!

Let's try this with something more complex. Create another graphic organizer and fill it out! A. 'Parents can take several steps to discourage TV watching and encourage reading.

<sup>2</sup>For one thing, have only one television set, and place it in the family room. <sup>3</sup>Then if your child wants privacy, he or she will have to go elsewhere, away from the TV. \*Secondly, connect reading with eating. \*Put a bookcase rather than a television in the kitchen, and make sure it is filled with comics, magazines, local newspapers, and so on. Explain that all snacks have to be eaten in the kitchen. 'Given the fact that most kids can go only a short time without putting food in their mouths, your kids should get a lot of reading done while they're snacking. 8Last of all, don't even dream of putting a television set in a child's bedroom. You want your kids to fall asleep over books, not glued to a flickering screen.
