Task*

You are the author of a weekly travel blog and your next article is about New York City. Consider the various travel blogs read this semester, model your own travel blog on those you have found to be most appealing to you (or combine the best features of a few different blogs).

* Students do not need to visit any location. All research can be done virtually

Category of Tourism: Students will be assigned a category of tourism (see below) and will write the travel blog with that area of tourism in mind.

1. Historic Tourism (Gissell, Martha)
2. Sports Tourism (Temia, Manindar)
3. Food and Drink Tourism (Milly, Martha)
4. Retail Tourism (Jadira, Sofia)
5. Adventure Tourism (Dayneanda)
6. Heritage Tourism (Susan, Cristina)
7. Cultural Tourism (Darimari, Abigail)

Expectations

- Students will use their assigned category of tourism to inform the information included in their travel blog. Include:
 - Activities (points of interest) ~ Food and Beverage ~ Transportation ~ Lodging
- Hyper link to all places of business or activities included in the blog
- All citations must be included at the end of the blog in APA format
- Proofread and submitted on time
- NOTE: Include the food item you researched for Prof. Stewart's Class

Format

- Travel Blog (use examples from the blogs we read this semester).
- The information presented in your blog should represent a 36 hour period of time.
- Submit as a post on the course assignment page on the HMG1101 OpenLab site. Choose the category "student travel blog"
- Title the post with a title that represents what you write example "Retail Therapy in NYC" or "NYC Adventures and Happenings"
- Embed in the post, the links to the online sources you use
- Include an APA style reference list at the end of the blog
- Images
 - Include 5-8 images
 - Upload to the site only the images you will use in your post.
 - Any images (whether they are your own or other from someone else) must have a photo credit. Example (photo credit: Goodlad)
- Alternative format, post a PDF of your blog on the OpenLab site, choose the category "student travel blog"

- Discuss the scope of the hospitality and tourism industry
- Gather information from observation in regard to the hospitality industry from a local, national and global perspective
