


Why Participate?

My Action Plan: Spring 2022

What do you need to do during the first two weeks?

- Attend Department Connect Day
- Make copy of semester schedule from CUNYfirst
- Collect syllabi from all classes
- Review syllabi + Ask questions
- Download Spring Academic Calendar
- Compile list of important dates
- Put all dates in ONE calendar/planner
- Do 'Time Management Math'
- Create daily + weekly schedules (set alarms!)

- Get books + course materials
- Make a good impression in your classes (be prepared, be on time, active learner, hand in assignments)
